

On Sunday, September 8, we will recognize Dr. Raymon Leake as Pastor Emeritus of First Baptist Meridian during our morning worship time. The word "Emeritus" comes from Latin and initially referred to veteran soldiers who served faithfully for a sufficient duration so as to earn, or "merit," their discharge from the service.

Dr. Leake faithfully served as pastor of our church family for over two decades. To put that in perspective, the average tenure of a pastor is currently about six years, which is substantially longer than the mid-1990s (when Dr. Leake came to Meridian). At that time, the average pastoral tenure had dropped to roughly three-and-a-half years.

During his time as our pastor, Dr. Leake was a healer following a season of controversy. He also led the "Restoring for Tomorrow" campaign, which raised five million dollars to renovate various facets of our church campus. He baptized many of your children and grandchildren. He married young couples and buried faithful servants. He preached the Word and pastored the flock. So on Sunday, September 8, we honor a veteran soldier of the army of the Lord by making him "Pastor Emeritus." And, in good Southern Baptist fashion, we will have a potluck meal following morning worship. We are likely to have several guests from the Leake family and from Bucatunna Baptist Church (Raymon's present pastorate), so we are asking FBCM members to bring a substantial side dish and dessert for the meal. The church will provide chicken and drinks. I hope to see you there. Blessinas.
