RUTH: CONTEXT

- Bridges Judges and Monarchy
- Non-Jewish Protagonist (Moabite)
- Female Protagonist
- One of 5 Festal Scrolls:
 - Read at Pentecost
 - Universality of Yahweh
- Ruth is reminiscent of Abraham



RUTH: CHARACTERS

- Ruth = Friend
- Naomi = PleasantMara = Bitter
- Elimelech = My God is King
- Mahlon = Sickly
- Chilion = Weak
- Boaz = Strength is in him
- Obed = Servant



RUTH: PLOT

- 1. SETTING: Famine in Bethlehem ("House of Bread")
 - Irony: God had provided bread and water in the wilderness, but there was famine in the land due to their perpetual abandonment of the covenant.
- 2. Israelites living in Moab (cf. Numbers 25).
- 3. Israelites dying outside the land (exile...).
- 4. Ruth remains with Naomi/Mara despite lack of prospects for progeny...

Ruth 1:16 But Ruth replied: Don't plead with me to abandon you or to return and not follow you. For wherever you go, I will go, and wherever you live, I will live; your people will be my people, and your God will be my God. ¹⁷ Where you die, I will die, and there I will be buried. May the Lord punish me, and do so severely, if anything but death separates you and me.

RUTH: PLOT
