Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 5:6-7

### Church Family,

I pray this finds you well. I miss all of you, so much! I pray for you every day and look forward to the day we can all gather again for corporate worship. In the following paragraphs you'll find some of my musings about prayer and an invitation for a way you can pray for our church.

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall give praise to God." Romans 14:11

I ran across a video last week of two cockatoos sitting on their perch while their owner sang Elvis' "Don't Be Cruel" to them. One of the birds sat calmly listening to the music. The other began bouncing and swaying to the beat, flapping his feathers wildly, much to the consternation of the first bird. With each measure of music, the second bird's response became more pronounced and he edged more and more in to the first bird's personal space. By the end of the video the first bird was clinging desperately to the very edge of his perch, trying to get away from the antics of the second bird.

About now you must be saying to yourselves "Where is this going???" So, here's the application (in my life, and maybe yours): I've always found it fascinating that birds could sit on a perch, sometimes in impossible positions, sometimes even sleeping, and not fall off, like the first bird in the video. Serendipitously, I came upon the answer just yesterday. The tendons of the bird's legs are made so that when the legs are bent at the knee, the claws contract and grip like a steel trap. The claws refuse to let go until the knees are unbent.

The bended knee helps the bird to hold on.

The same is true for Christians, to a degree. When we pray on bended knee, literally or figuratively, we find strength to hold on-and certainly there are times (like right now) when we need to hold on. When we are frightened, sad, lonely, or anxious, we need strength beyond our own. To bow down is as much a mental attitude as it is a physical posture. To acknowledge one's need and to bow down before the right source is the key. So, the next time you are really troubled, remember how a bird holds on so tightly to their perch. The bent knee gives the bird very unusual strength. The same is true for us!
