# Dear Church Family,

I **MISS** you wonderful people. By the grace of God, I hope that I don't have to miss you much longer. For the past several weeks, our staff has been thinking, praying, and planning through resuming corporate worship and gradually pursuing a return to our weekly ministries. The predictably bad news is that this will occur gradually rather than all-at-once. The good news is that we are on the cusp of a major milestone in that process.

# After much consideration, we have decided to resume corporate worship on <u>Sunday morning</u>,

**June 14.** Even so, we are acutely aware the we are still in the midst of this pandemic, so we will have several (hopefully) *short-term* precautions in place.

- We will not resume on-campus Sunday School classes until this fall. For the immediate future, we want to avoid intermingling groups in confined spaces. This means that, starting June 14, Sunday School classes will need to find a time to meet via Zoom (or the platform of their choice) that allows participants to attend corporate worship in person if desired. Similarly, we will continue to have Wednesday night Bible study online for the duration of the summer.
- We recommend (but will not require) that you wear masks when entering and exiting the sanctuary. If you do not have a mask, we will have disposable masks available. Additionally, we will provide hand sanitizer stations throughout the welcome center and at the entrance to the sanctuary if needed.
- We ask that you sit only with immediate family in the sanctuary, maintaining a social distance of 6-to-10 feet between families during worship. We will assist in this effort by marking off some pews temporarily. I know everybody has "their pew," but we humbly ask that

you grant this short-term concession in pursuit of our long-term goals. Similarly, when entering and exiting the sanctuary, please avoid congregating too closely. For those desiring additional space, the fellowship hall will be available as an overflow worship area with worship livestreamed.

- We ask that you actively refrain from hugs, handshakes, and other gestures of affection during this time. You will see clever reminders about this around the facility, including my personal favorites: "Spread the Gospel, not the germs" and "Love thy neighbor; sanitize thy hands."
- We will not be passing offering plates during this time. Gloved ushers will be stationed at the sanctuary entrance at the beginning of worship to dispense bulletins and at the end of worship to accept any tithes and offerings. Should you desire, you can still give through the drop box near the church office, online (via the ShelbyNext app or fbcmeridian.org), or by mail.
- For the immediate future, we will not provide childcare or children's church during worship. Caitlin will still do a children's sermon (which will be visible on the large screen), but we will ask children to remain with their parents. Additionally, we will provide a handout to help keep children occupied during worship, and the fellowship hall will be utilized as an overflow area (with worship livestreaming on the televisions).
- We encourage "at-risk" members to take every precaution concerning their physical wellness, possibly continuing to worship from home if desired.

We are confident that these concessions and inconveniences are only for a season. If you have any symptoms associated with the virus, please worship from home because we want to do all we can to promote the wellness of our entire church family during this time. For now, we genuinely look forward to seeing and worshipping with you *in-person* soon. And we continue to thank God for His faithfulness—and yours—to our church and the mission of His Kingdom.
