- Story speeds up!
- Increased prophetic presence/message (enforcing covenant)
- Short-lived "revivals"
- Reminders of Egypt
- Moving toward exile
- Israel falls in 722 B.C.
- Judah falls in 587 B.C.

FALLOUT FROM SOLOMON

- Kingdom Splits (Israel & Judah)
- Idolatry (Jeroboam puts golden calves in Dan and Bethel)
- Kingdoms hurdle toward exile/slavery.

ISRAEL (10 Northern Tribes)

JUDAH (2 Southern Tribes)

Kingdom lasts approx. 209 Years

20 Kings

9 Ruling Dynasties

7 Assassinations

All judged "evil" in God's sight

Conquered by Assyria in 722 B.C.; dispersed throughout empire

Kingdom lasts approx. 345 Years

19 Kings, 1 Queen

2 Ruling Dynasties

5 Assassinations

8 judged "good" in God's sight, but only 2 without qualification

Conquered by Babylon in 587 B.C. with exiles sent to Babylon

AAL YAHWEH & ELIJAH

Baal, as storm-god, controls the rains.

Elijah commands drought (1 Kings 17:1).

Baal ensures agricultural fertility and bountiful harvests.

Israel experiences famine and drought, yet Elijah and Elisha provide grain and oil miraculously (2 Kings 4:1–7, 42–44).

Baal controls both lightning and fire.

Elijah commands fire from heaven in the name of Yahweh (1 Kings 18:38; 2 Kings 1:10–12; 2:11).

Baal controls life and death (food & fertility).

Elijah and Elisha heal and raise the dead in the name of Yahweh (1 Kings 17:7–24; 2 Kings 4:8–37; 5:1–20).
