MORE DETAILS INSIDE MESSENGER

Greetings, Church Family!

By way of reminder, we will resume corporate worship on Sunday, June 14. Even so, we are still very much in the midst of an ongoing pandemic, so we want to utilize our immediate situation in pursuit of our ultimate goal. As a result, we have chosen to adopt the following measures for the time being to increase the safety of our gatherings:

- We request that you wear a mask, especially
 while entering and exiting the facility. We will
 have masks as needed in addition to sanitizer
 stations. Please avoid congregating too closely in
 the parking lot or welcome center. Please refrain
 from making physical contact beyond your immediate family. We will actively encourage social
 distancing even outside of the sanctuary.
- We will utilize every other pew in the sanctuary. In the middle section, we will utilize even-numbered pews. On the outside sections, we will utilize odd-numbered pews. We know everyone is ready to sit in their usual spot, but please assist us with this measure for the current season.
- We will seat worship attenders as though you were at a wedding.
 - <u>Greeters/ushers</u> will be stationed at the front and rear entrances to the sanctuary. We will have overflow seating in the fellowship hall if needed or desired.
 - <u>Greeters/ushers</u> will be masked, gloved, and ready to seat you. Please sit with your immediate family so that we can maximize our utilization of space while maintaining appropriate distance between groups.
 - <u>Greeters/ushers</u> will provide you with as many bulletins or children's activity pages as you need.

- We will begin seating at 10:00 AM. During this current season, David is utilizing the 9:00-10:00 hour for rehearsals with our various ensembles. As a result, we will begin seating worship attenders at 10:00. Please arrive closer to 10:00 so that we do not "bottleneck" in the Welcome Center and have plenty of time to seat families prior to worship.
- For the immediate future, the musical portion of our worship will be led by our various ensembles, but we will not have congregational singing. Without question, this was among the most difficult - and among the most informed stances we have taken. Naturally, we cannot and will not force anyone to refrain from singing, but we humbly request your adherence to this measure. David and I would be happy to provide more information or resources if anyone (understandably) has questions.
- At the conclusion of worship, we will dismiss the congregation by section.
- During this time, we will not pass the offering plate during the offertory. When we are leaving worship, our greeters/ushers will have collection plates for anyone desiring to contribute on their way out. Additionally, you can continue giving through the ShelbyNext app, by clicking the "Give" tab on our website, by utilizing the drop box in the welcome center, or through mailing tithes and offerings directly to the church office.

We realize that these measures may seem invasive to some and insufficient to others. We humbly submit them to you as the fruit of our best thought, discussion, and prayer as we navigate the unknowns of this episode.

We also understand completely that some will decide to continue worshipping from home due to being "at-risk" or due to potential complications

created by navigating some of the temporary measures we are adopting/promoting. We love you. We miss you. And we understand completely.

I am so thankful to be your pastor, and I am so proud to call you my church family. I cannot tell you how much I have missed what we call "normal." But, by the grace of God, we will get through this. May He bless us with hearts to love well, souls to trust well, minds to think well, and strength to serve well as we do so. And may He find us faithful in all things.
