Ryan and Kelley Day had good jobs and were ready to start a family. Ryan worked in environmental science, and Kelley was an architect. They lived in Virginia and began going on

missions trips with their church, Grace Life Baptist. They went to Thailand, Taiwan, and Kenya. While working at a local pregnancy resource center, Kelley was introduced to several internationals who had never heard of Jesus. "Our hearts especially grew for those who were lost and have little chance to hear the gospel," Ryan says. God completely changed the couple's worldview. They left their jobs and what their families and culture considered normal and acceptable and contacted the International Mission Board.

Today, the Days are church planters in Japan's third-largest city, Nagoya, located in the center of the country. "We seek to partner with local Japanese believers to plant healthy churches in our city," Ryan says. There is only one church for every 23,000 people in a city that is home to 9 million.

Besides being missionaries, the Days are also parents to four young adopted children. "Our children and the way we parent have been a great way to enter talks about Jesus," the Days say. The children's adoption also bring questions from some Japanese people who see children as a means to benefit the family and not born to be loved.

Japanese people can be distrustful of Americans and Christianity, but the Days are trying to overcome this divide. Pray for the Days as they work hard to give the unreached people of Japan the opportunity to know Jesus. (*Missions Mosaic, July 2020*)
