Church Family,

For the past several Sundays, we have been progressing through the Lord's Prayer as found in Matthew 6:9-13. This past Sunday, we explored the most counterintuitive petition of the prayer: "Let your Kingdom come." Jesus, we think, don't you mean "let us go to your kingdom"? Yet, Jesus' prayer is not one seeking an escape to Heaven, but rather Heaven's intervention on earth. This is why Jesus continues: "Let your kingdom come; let your will be done as in Heaven so also on the earth."

On Tuesday nights, I have been reading and discussing C. S. Lewis's classic apologetic work, *Mere Christianity*, with some of our college students and young adults. During this week's gathering, one of the chapters we discussed centered on pride. Pride puffs up and inflates. Pride is competitive, looking out for its own interests and glory. Describing pride, Lewis said: "According to Christian teachers, the essential vice, the utmost evil, is Pride. Unchastity, anger, greed, drunkenness, and all that, are mere fleabites in comparison: it was through Pride that the devil became the devil. Pride leads to every other vice: it is the complete anti-God state of mind." (*Mere Christianity*, 121-122)

Pride is a many-headed hydra desiring to harden us in a direction (and toward a destination) diametrically opposed to God—as Lewis calls it, "the complete anti-God state of mind." What does Lewis set forth as the remedial virtue opposite of pride? *Humility*. Humility serves. Humility lowers itself. Humility *comes down*.

Within his model prayer, Jesus' does not emphasize people going to God, but rather God coming to people. God is, after all, the God who walks in the garden to fellowship with Adam and Eve. He is the God who *comes down* Mt. Sinai to dwell in the tabernacle (Exodus 40; and later, the Temple in 2 Chronicles 7) while leading His people

through the wilderness. He is ultimately the God-who comes down to us in Jesus Christ (John 1). He is the God who, over and over again, comes down to His people. For God's Kingdom to come and His will to be done as in Heaven on Earth would require a KING able and willing to exercise the authority of Heaven on Earth to implement God's will (Matthew 28:18). What would that look like? It would look like the ministry of Jesus: our Lord, our Messiah, our KING.

In Philippians 2:5-8, Paul challenges the church to adopt this downward way: "Adopt the same attitude as that of Christ Jesus, who, existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God as something to be exploited. Instead he emptied himself by assuming the form of a servant, taking on the likeness of humanity. And when he had come as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death—even to death on a cross."

In a world that encourages us to build up as much as we can, Jesus teaches us to check the very foundation we build on. Jesus challenges us to seek not our own kingdom, but His. Jesus does not lead us in the rejection of a fallen world, but rather in the redemption of it. And, if we prayerfully seek this kingdom, we will gradually adopt the posture toward others that God adopted toward us: love, service, forgiveness, and—you guessed it—humility.
