

QUIET TIME

"In the morning...he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed." Mark 1:35

Mark has a rather unique style of relating the Gospel. As one writer said, "Mark hits the ground running." The book of Mark introduces Jesus by way of John the Baptist, and then you fasten your seat belt and hold on.

The first chapters of Mark are filled with constant activity of Jesus. One demand after another is described, but couched right in the middle of those early chapters is a description of Jesus doing something that was the key to his vitality. What may sound at first like an incidental statement was really the source of Jesus' energy: *he went to a deserted place and prayed.*

The incident took place on the morning after an extremely hectic day. Jesus had been teaching in the synagogue, was interrupted by a man with an unclean spirit, healed Simon's mother-in-law, and at sundown, all who were physically and spiritually sick were brought to him. When morning came, he

withdrew to a quiet place and prayed. Why do we have such a hard time accepting the necessity of solitude and prayer? We have time for everything else, but push our quiet time aside. If Jesus needed it, are we any different?
