

Jesus said...



TRUST ME!

"Ah, Lord God! Truly I do not know how to speak, for I am only a boy."

Jeremiah 1:6

The exchange that took place between God and Jeremiah on that day long ago sounds so human and so familiar. I do believe that I have heard parts of that conversation in my own life. God approached Jeremiah and broke the news that before he was even born God had chosen him to be a prophet. Jeremiah gave the classical response: "I am only..." In this case he said he was only a child. Faced with quite a challenge, Jeremiah felt he was not equal to the task.

At times all of us have been faced with a challenge from God—a task, an opportunity, an obligation, something that made us feel very inadequate, even though we also felt it was something we really should do. The way God dealt with Jeremiah is quite instructive for us as well. In effect, God told Jeremiah, "Don't say I'm only...anymore." That doesn't cut it. Next, God told him, "Just go to the people, and I will tell you what to say." Then God said, "I will go with you." That's it, Jeremiah; that's all you need!

The same is true for us. When we face challenges that we truly believe are given by God, the same advice applies. If we will just be faithful to the task, God will tell us what to do and will be with us in all that we attempt. "Lord, guide us each step, go with us, and that is enough." Amen.
