THE WHOLE WORLD

"You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea, and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8b

We have a way of relegating this verse to another group in another place. After all, Jesus was talking to his disciples who were present with him on a day long ago. Or was he? Actually, he was talking to all of us, in this day and this time. He left us a big job, as big as the whole world—"to the end of the earth." If we are concerned with proclaiming the Gospel, it is usually quite a provincial understanding of the Gospel. In other words, we had just as soon not go out of our comfort zone with it. The verse implies that we are to look up and out, beyond our normal circles.

A school boy was given a problem to solve that required the use of a compass. He had lost his compass, so he went to his teacher's desk to borrow hers. Because he was a little anxious, he could not remember the name of the instrument. He said to her, "May I take your circumference?"

The question in that setting may have been a little embarrassing, but it is an appropriate question for us today. What is our circumference? How large a circuit do we travel? What is the measure of our interest outside our backyard? No doubt, the place to begin is by having an interest in sharing the Gospel. But does that interest take us bevond our own backvard? Remember, Jesus said "to the end of the earth." That command is for us today.
