CUTTING TO THE CHASE

"Then he began to speak to them in parables. 'A man planted a vineyard, put a fence around it." Mark 12:1a

This verse is taken from Jesus' well-known parable of the tenants. This parable must have been important to Jesus and the recorders of the Gospels because it is found not only in Mark's Gospel, but also in Matthew and Luke—exactly the same story. This parable is full of important truths. Here are a few that jump out at me:

*God is generous. The vineyard was equipped with everything that was necessary to make the work of the cultivators profitable.

God also gives us all that we need.

- *God trusts us. The owner left the cultivators to run the vineyard themselves. God trusts us enough to give us freedom to run much of life as we choose.
- *God is patient. Not once or twice, but many times the master gave the cultivators the chance to pay the debt they owed. He treated them in a way they did not deserve.

God gives us more chances than we deserve.

- *God's justice will ultimately triumph. People might take advantage of the patience of God, but in the end comes judgement and justice. God may bear long with disobedience and rebellion, but in the end, God acts.
- *God gives us the freedom of rejection. Forced love is never love at all.
