

### CHURCH FAMILY,

"I knew him/her when...". This phrase captures that men and women of achievement often had much humbler beginnings. We sometimes say the phrase concerning people who go on to "bigger and better" things in life. For example, on Sunday, Evan McPherson kicked a game-winning field goal in overtime to clinch the season opener for the Cincinnati Bengals; but I knew him when he was a kid in the student ministry who acted out goofy parts in the vearly spring youth dramas. On Monday afternoon, I drove to Clinton and taught a seminary class on Baptist Heritage to students who called me "Dr. VanHorn," but earlier in the day I saw Dr. Tammy Anderson at the WMU lunch. Tammy leads women's ministries for the Mississippi Baptist Convention Board. A few decades ago, however, Tammy knew me when I was a bratty little professor's kid during our family's seminary's days. She was our babysitter. In Mark 6:4, Jesus observes, "A prophet is not without honor except in his hometown, among his relatives, and in his household"—in other words, among the people who knew him when. We almost cannot help ourselves: our experience with others in the past shapes our perceptions of them in the future.

This also captures something wonderful and unique about God. God knows us better than anyone else-including ourselves! In the opening verses of Psalm 139, the psalmist observes, "<sup>1</sup>LORD, you have searched me and known me.<sup>2</sup> You know when I sit down and when I stand up; you understand my thoughts from far away.<sup>3</sup> You observe my travels and my rest; you are aware of all my ways. <sup>4</sup> Before a word is on my tongue, you know all about it, LORD." He also knew us **before** anyone elseincluding ourselves! In verses 13-16, the psalmist continues, "13 For it was you who created my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.<sup>14</sup> will praise you because I have been remarkably and wondrously made.' Your works are wondrous, and I know this very well. ... <sup>16</sup> Your eyes saw me when I was formless; all my days were written in your book and planned before a single one of them began." "But, perhaps most importantly, God also loves us

**beyond** anyone else—including ourselves! The rhythm of Scripture does not suggest that God finds us at our best only to say "I knew him/her when...", but rather a God who stands by us at our lowliest and worst, saying, "I'll know him/her when..."

God knows the kid in the youth group who will, one day, play in the NFL and use that platform to bring praise and glory to God. God knows He won't give up on the bratty preacher/professor's kid whom He will call to pastoral ministry one day. The psalmist, who realizes this, thus concludes by entreating God, "<sup>23</sup> Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my concerns. <sup>24</sup> See if there is any offensive way in me; lead me in the everlasting way." You can trust God because He knows you **better**; He knew you **before**; but He also loves you **beyond** what you can imagine. God, thank you for loving us like you do. Help us love others the same way you love us.
