## Church Family,

This morning I shared a post to my social media (which had been shared by another pastor) capturing the long-term impact of small habits. It said: "Reading twenty pages a day is 30 books per year. Saving \$10 per day is \$3,650 per year. Running 1 mile per day is 365 miles per year. Becoming 1% better per day is 37x better per year." We live in such an explosive age of rapid change that we convince ourselves (sometimes, at least) that anything worthwhile must be big, exciting, or all-at-once. But the thrill of buying a home usually comes with a 15-, 20-, or 30-year mortgage. Our children change drastically from birth to graduation, and while there are growth spurts along the way, most of the change is subtle and incremental.

The other day, I was working out in our garage, and Judah was impressed by how much I could lift. I told him what I lifted when I was in shape, and he was in disbelief. Then I asked him if I lost my former level of fitness overnight, and at nine years old he knew the answer: nope—it was little by little, a day at a time (for the record, that's the only way I'll get it back). So many Christians I know (myself included sometimes) get disappointed when we can't see God doing "big things" around us, tempted to wonder whether He is working at all. But His word also calls us not to despise the "day of small things" (check out Zechariah 4:7-10). Jesus tells the parable of the mustard seed, which grows from something minute into something monumental (Matthew 13:31-32). Most of the Christians I know who are boldest in prayer and in sharing their faith got there one conversation at a time. In the same post I shared, a pastor (Thomas Fletcher) noted: "Praying 10 minutes a day is 60 hours per year. Three-ish chapters a day is the whole Bible per year. Asking one different person a week is inviting 52 people to church per year. Having an intentional conversation with someone about how you can help them grow spiritually once a month is discipling 12 times per year."

I believe that the devil's toolkit is all too predictable: division, distraction, discouragement. These words are all too common in our hearts and minds these days, but "greater is He that is in you than He who is in the world!" (1 John 4:4). I believe that God is better than we believe Him to be. I believe His Word promises to us in Christ will stand the test of time. I believe He is at work in our church and in your life. Keep showing up. Keep taking that "next step" in your faith, however small. Keep getting into His Word. Keep seeking the Spirit's power in living for God's glory. Maybe He's up to something big, even if it feels oh so small in this moment.
