

Who AM WHO AM I? "Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" (Exodus 3:11)

Have you ever dealt with the feeling that you are unimportant? Have you ever wondered if your life really counts for anything? Many years ago God spoke to Moses from a burning bush and essentially said, "I am concerned about my people. I'm sending you to Pharaoh to tell him to let my people go." (Excuse me, Lord, would you repeat that?) Moses made the usual statement, "But I am a nobody." Although he did as he was told.
