# **KEEP GOING!**

"As for you, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness." Timothy 6:11

Near the end of this very intimate and personal letter, Paul makes his plea with young Timothy. At the risk of oversimplifying this speech, one might compare it to a half-time talk by a wise coach who has been in that position many times. After all, this exhortation is not addressed to a non-believer, but to one who has already begun his Christian pilgrimage.

Precisely at that point when most of us are so susceptible to becoming lax and apathetic, Paul says, "Let's get with it. Let's get serious." Paul was suggesting a type of determination when he told Timothy to fight the good fight. He was talking about the good fight of being a worthy disciple of Christ. Discipleship is not for sissies. It is for believers with drive, courage, faith and fearlessness.

What are the qualities of a determined disciple? First, discipleship means taking responsibility for your life. If you are to commit it, you must first claim it. Second, a disciple must understand the importance of the right kind of living. Don't desire to be superficial; just live a life that is right. Third, remember your own witness. We are representative of Christ. We are disciples. Paul could just as easily be giving *us* a pep talk during half time - in fact, he was. Keep going!
