

SEEING 18

THE 7 SIGNS OF JESUS...

A sermon series about the miracles of Jesus from the Gospel of John beginning SUNDAY, MAY 14th

OFF THE WALL

"We'll see!"

When our boys were much

younger, it seemed every question they asked would be answered with that phrase. The guestion could change, but the answer never did. That answer seemed to be most appropriate and bought us, the parents, enough time to make a proper decision. Can we get ice cream? We'll see. Can I get a toy at the store? We'll see. Can we go swimming? We'll see. Can we go to Disney World? We'll see. It wasn't a hard no and wasn't a definite yes. It simply meant that the parents needed to process the question while making sure the persistent questioning didn't take place. I'm sure you've done it. "Hey, do you want to grab lunch this week?" "That sounds great. Let me take a look at my schedule and get back with you." A form of "we'll see". One day, while in the car as a family, Carter (age 4 or 5 at the time) asked a question that was answered appropriately with, "we'll see". Jackson, 4 years older and with much more wisdom at the time, decided to teach Carter an important lesson in life by blurting out, "we'll see means NO". Perhaps it does.

In John's Gospel account, there are seven "signs" or miracles that take place from chapter 2 to chapter 11. It is interesting that John does not call them miracles but instead calls them signs (think of billboards...not road signs). The purpose is for John's readers to SEE. To see that Jesus is the Messiah. To see that Jesus is God. To see that Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. You might be questioning your relationship with God, or even skeptical about religion. You might even be saying to God, "we'll see". Well, John wants you to

know that seeing is believing, and he lays out the evidence that Jesus is who He says He is. Over the next seven weeks we will be taking a look at each of these "signs". I invite you to join us. Join us for Sunday School, join us for worship, join us for fellowship, join us as family! If seeing truly is believing, then instead of saying "we'll see", I would ask you to "come see"!
