Sermon Series continues with the church in Smyrna...

Sunday, September 17 10:30 a.m. In the spring of 1986 the world became familiar with the word "Chernobyl". A nuclear energy reated on the Pripyat River, near the city

actor, situated on the Pripyat River, near the city of Chernobyl, Ukraine, went out of control, caused an explosion, and a subsequent release of a deadly radioactive cloud and fumes. News of the event was slow to be released from the Soviet controlled state. The rest of the world anxiously waited to see how the disaster would affect other nations in Europe as the radioactive cloud expanded and moved toward the atmosphere. Buses were eventually brought in to evacuate those living near the facility. Many boarded the buses thinking they would be able to return in a few short days, not understanding the towns would be abandoned forever. Workers desperately attempted to assess the situation and control the reactor that was in full "meltdown". Later, a shelter structure, commonly referred to as "the sarcophagus", was constructed using 14 million cubic feet of concrete. Experts hoped the structure would last 20-30 years. A larger and updated structure was placed in service in 2016 at the cost of nearly 2.1 billion dollars. People know the name "Chernobyl". Lives were changed forever. Generations who will never have witnessed the power plant producing energy will still know the name "Chernobyl" because maintenance will NEVER end for that facility. What caused the disaster? Two main contributions led to the meltdown at Chernobyl. 1. Faulty design and 2. Poorly trained workers. History tells us those two factors are a recipe for disaster. What does that have to do with church? Why are we looking at the 7 churches who received letters in the book of Revelation? Because the same is true for church! If we have a faulty design and do a poor job of training our "workers" (volunteers), we will leave a mark on those who come after

us that will not be positive. Christ gives warnings to the churches in Asia minor about their design and function. He also encouraged their workers (members, participants, volunteers) to be trained to keep their focus on Him. No, we aren't heading for nuclear meltdown, but we need to make sure our design and training stay on track. I am looking forward to walking through these letters with you.
