### COMMITMENT



"Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil."

Ephesians 5:15 - 16

The last part of this verse has always caught my ear. "Wise men make the most of the time." You cannot read these words of Paul without sensing his urgency about the work he was doing as an ambassador of Christ. He was strongly suggesting that the Ephesians look carefully at what they were doing. We also have much to do, and time is important. Unfortunately, too many of us have no sense of urgency in regard to our work for the Kingdom. After all, this work has been going on for a long time. Why get in a rush? We have an eternity to get the job done. On the other hand, we will live in a state of hurry for almost everything else in life. Matters of faith are different.

One of the greatest enemies of the Christian faith is apathy, the feeling of being lukewarm about our commitment and task. Paul was calling the believers at Ephesus to be alive to the moment and feel a sense of enthusiasm and urgency! Is there an enthusiasm in your Christian walk? Do the matters of your faith have a sense of urgency about them? Paul would tell each of us today to be careful as we walk and to walk as a wise person and make the very most of our time. No sirens are blowing, but time is flying.
